To help keep you apprised of ASLC financial position, the following table provides financial information thru the end of June '22.

While the information in the above table is positive, on a YTD basis, during the month of June our expenses exceeded our revenue by \$15,371. On a year-to-date basis, expenses are up 3.24% (after adjusting for temporarily restricted expenses). At the same time, YTD General Giving is up 12.86% (\$14,459). As previously reported more givers have paid their commitment for the year during the first six months of 2022 than in the first six months of 2021. Therefore, the financial results for the balance of the year may be negatively impacted by this "early" giving. The Pre-school shows a loss of \$8,299 on a year-to-date basis, as of the end of June.

Be on the lookout for your giving statement, for the first six months of the year, they will be mailed shortly.

The Committee is currently working on the Fall giving campaign, "Grace in Action." Commitment Sunday has been set for 10-30-22. Additional information and background will be provided for your consideration as the Fall Campaign starts on 09-11-22. Part of the effort in this year's campaign will be to encourage electronic giving, like Simply Giving, as well as other electronic methods like bill pay thru your financial institution.

LUTHERAN ADVOCACY MINISTRY-NM: God's Work, Our Voices Advocating on Behalf of Our Kids: We Can Do More

"Early childhood development . . . unfolds at a breathtaking pace. We have long understood children's development to their full potential as a fundamental human right. We now know, from . . . neuroscience research, just how critical the early years of life are in the development of a child's brain and in shaping their future. Meanwhile, economics has shown us the great benefits of investing in young children during this unique developmental window and the wrenching costs, to children and societies, of failing to do so." UNICEF Report.¹

When I worked at a university, I occasionally taught courses to help first-year students hone skills for college success. Some students revealed things that surprised me. One apologized for missing class and submitted papers verifying his court appearance on assault charges. Another had problems finding daycare for her child. Others gave class presentations, mentioning their time in rehab or jail. They were precious New Mexico teens, and I was moved by their efforts to get an education. I was glad courses such as the ones I taught existed, but they seemed too little too late. These young people already had endured much.

The United Nations' program, UNICEF, reminds us that societies globally must invest in their children early. Early Childhood Education is one way to make that investment. How much does the U.S. publicly invest per toddler in early education and care? \$500 per year, according to Elizabeth Davis and Aaron Sojourner.² The governments of Norway, Finland, and Denmark invest over \$20,000 per toddler. Germany, Sweden, and Slovenia follow with investments ranging from \$18,000-plus down to \$10,000. Others like Australia and Chile come in under \$10,000 per toddler but still are in the thousands. We, in our country, can do more.

What about New Mexico? We have moved from 50th to 49th among states in the well-being of our children.³ We are going in the right direction, but we can do more.

Some actions that we, as advocates for our children, can take are these:

Learn as much as we can about **the Early Childhood Education Amendment** that will be on our general election ballots this fall. The following may be useful sources:

HALLELUJAH RINGERS




