One of Jesus' most famous parables is usually called "The Parable of the Prodigal Son." But this is actually a parable designed to teach us about the merciful, generous nature of God. And to the extent that "prodigal" means extravagant or over-the-top, that word is better applied to the father in the story.

The son comes home hoping for a modest meal in exchange for an apology. Before he can say a word, however, his father is lavishing him with love and making preparations for a party. For the prodigal parent, only a splendid celebration will do.

Jesus says that God – The Prodigal Parent – puts grace into action this way: welcoming us home even when we don't "deserve" it; forgiving us completely before we can even ask; and treating just the sight of us as cause for extravagant joy.

At our best, this sort of celebratory welcome is what All Saints is all about—welcoming visitors and regulars alike into the beautiful choreography of worship and celebration. We strive to be a community of joy – prodigal, extravagant, and free – for anyone who longs for a meal, an embrace, and the reassurance that they are not alone.

This welcome is about repairing the world through love, one celebration at a time. That's Grace in Action. You can hear it in the language we use: we celebrate Communion, celebrate Baptism and Affirmation of Baptism, celebrate Easter, celebrate Christmas. In September, we celebrated when eight new members joined our congregation.

And speaking of celebration: we're looking forward to celebrating Giving Sunday with you on October 30. That will be a party you won't want to miss – with all our music ensembles leading us in Reformation Sunday worship!

By now you should have received a pledge card to make a financial commitment for 2023. Please pray the prayer on the back, fill out the card, and bring it on Commitment Sunday, October 30.

clothes. Strong backs and a truck or SUV are a plus!

Then the next two days for returns for better fitting.

Day One 3-6 pm - Day Two 9-3pm - Day Three 10-3pm

Job C-Take Clothes back to the Donation Center

Load up clothes at the hotel and transport them back to Donation Center. Unload clothes. Strong backs and a truck or SUV are a plus!

Usually the 3rd day after the bus arrival.

Job D-Help at the Donation Center

Accept donations from donors. Sort and shelve the clothes. Get clothes ready for delivery to hotel.



<u>Bread for the World</u> is partnering nationally with <u>Interfaith Power & Light</u> to advocate for justice and sustainability in the 2023 reauthorization of the U.S Farm Bill. Important provisions include those addressing climate change and protecting nutrition programs. To refine its legislative proposal, Bread for the World is holding listening sessions around the country, including one in **Albuquerque**.

Music Ministry Notes

"God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in times of trouble." ~Psalm 46:1

Honestly, I had never truly thought about it until now. It was just what we did! Tradition. Even though it was not sung during the celebration of Reformation until many years after Luther's death, it is known as "the Battle Hymn of the Reformation" and a great source of strength. Martin Luther wrote the hymn during a time of "anfechtung" – translated "temptation" or "trial", this word refers to anything that causes doubt, anxiety, fear, or suffering. He based the hymn on Psalm 46 and due to his emotional state at the time, intended it to be a song of comfort and hope. As we sing this hymn, we are reminded to take comfort in the Word of God (God's Mighty Fortress) and that the Word will remain, no matter what. We can have faith that we are not forgotten and that God's love never fails.

That word above all earthly powers,
No thanks to them, abideth;
The Spirit and the gifts are ours
Through Him who with us sideth:
Let goods and kindred go,
This mortal life also;
The body they may kill:
God's truth abideth still,
His Kingdom is forever.

SPOTLIGHT ON: Shelley Takeuchi

I have been so impressed by all of the wonderful people of All Saints Lutheran Church. This church is a very talented and giving church. I thought affirming one extraordinary member by telling her story would be nice.

Occasionally, one meets a person who makes you smile whenever you see them. Maybe it's because her shining eyes reflect her goodness in all she does. But let me tell you—there is much more about Shelley than meets the eye.

I asked Shelley what some of her favorite things to do are. She said she loved helping others, so



she started Shelley's Shuttle. She drives people who can't get around as quickly as others. She told me it started with the "sweetest couple who happened to be blind." They work full-time at the Commission for the Blind, helping others with related disabilities. They are Shelley's inspiration and one of the reasons she focuses on helping others. She said they are great examples of what Christ would be like if he were blind. They see more clearly than many sighted people, especially when helping others.



Shelley also just attended the grand opening of The Book of Names, Ireicho, at the Japanese American National Museum in LA. It is the first listing of all 250,284 names of the Japanese Americans who were incarcerated in 75 sites around the US, including Assembly Centers, Internment Camps, Department of Justice Camps, etc., during WWII. The book contains all of Shelley's husband Kirk's relatives, and she got to place a Hanko mark beside the names of his grandfather, his dad, and his mom. These relatives, and many more, are listed in this book as the size of the Gutenberg Bible.

Attached is a photo of Kirk's grandmother, his aunt, and the two oldest uncles on his father's side, all born in Japan and all sent to different internment camps.

Shelley's favorite Bible verse is 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18: "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances."

Thank you, Shelley, for all that you do for others.

SIERRA VISTA SCHOOL BACKPACK FOOD COLLECTION PROJECT

School is back in session, and Sierra Vista Elementary School is again starting its backpack food collection project.

For many years, the All Saints Community Outreach Committee has sponsored this program twice a year, which provides children from low-income families to take food home on Fridays for the weekend. The drive provides nutritional food and snacks for many families at Sierra Vista Elementary School in Paradise Hills. At one time, over 20 backpacks were being filled each week to be taken home by needy students on Friday for weekend meals.

There are fewer participants at the current restart of this program, but it is expected that more will be added as needs are noted and as the school has supplies available. At this time, Sierra Vista has no sponsors providing food, so staff and some community members supply food as they are able. We at All Saints are pleased to resume this Outreach project once again and sponsor a food drive through October.

If you haven't already received a letter from the Development Committee, you will shortly. The letter is an introduction to this year's pledge campaign, "Grace in Action," which will culminate on October 30th, Commitment Sunday. As a part of this year's campaign, we will be holding Gatherings on two Sundays after church service. The purpose of the gatherings is to provide an opportunity to discuss giving and our commitments to support the ministry and programs of ASLC. These gatherings will be held on **October 9th & 23th.** Please mark your calendar to participate in one of the Gatherings.

To help keep you apprised of ASLC financial position, the following table provides financial information through the end of August '22.

| Expenses | \$212,014 | \$214,377 |

The information in the above table is positive on a YTD basis, and our revenue exceeded our expenses during August by \$1,117. On a year-to-date basis, expenses decreased by 6.73% (after adjusting for temporarily restricted expenses). At the same time, YTD General Giving is up 12.05% (\$17,340). Previously, we have reported that more givers have paid their commitment for the year during the first six months of 2022 than in the first six months of 2021. As we have moved through the year, the "early" giving hasn't had a negative impact on overall giving.

The preschool shows a loss of \$6,468 on a year-to-date basis as of the end of August, due to lower summer enrollment.


