Advocacy Spotlight

God's Work, Our Voices Judy Messal, Lutheran Advocacy Ministry, NM

"Just as we take care of the houses where we live, making sure they are well maintained to prevent future problems, we advocate in society to take care of problems that otherwise result in hunger, homelessness, and other forms of poverty and injustice,"

Kurt Rager.

Kurt Rager, Director of Lutheran Advocacy Ministry-NM, grew up as a member of All Saints Lutheran Church—and as an advocate. Learning to do advocacy entailed knowing how our political and governmental systems work. Kurt's mentor was his father, a person who had immersed himself in those systems in New Mexico. He introduced Kurt to civic engagement at a young age.

Each year, father and son would take time to go from Corrales to Santa Fe to watch the State Legislature in session. Mr. Rager would ask Kurt to peruse the list of bills that had been introduced and find some that would be good for young people. Kurt would choose his legislation and then write for copies of those bills. After studying them, he and his dad would return to Santa Fe to see how a particular bill fared in a committee hearing or how it was voted on in the House or Senate. Kurt, as a young teen, was able to offer public testimony in a committee hearing on a bill he found important. As he remembers it, the legislation concerned bicycles and bike paths.

Kurt's upbringing determined his major at the University of New Mexico: Religious Studies and Political Science. As a young member of All Saints in the early 1980s, Kurt worked with Lavonne Abruzzi to organize an advocacy effort for the congregation. They designed bulletin board posts to update people on important public issues and to suggest how they could get involved. He and Lavonne also organized a candidate forum near election time, ensuring that candidates of all parties were invited. Faith-based advocacy done with integrity is strictly nonpartisan.

Around this time in Kurt's life, the extraordinary Nima Ward was working at the synod level to set up the Lutheran Office of Governmental Ministry (LOGM) in New Mexico. Kurt was ready to work hand in hand with Nima. By then, he had taken on the position of Director of Education and Youth Ministry at St. Paul Lutheran Church. There, he helped organize a Youth Volunteer Corps to do service projects. The youth learned not only direct service but also how to advocate. Each year, Kurt would take from fifteen to twenty-five teens to Santa Fe. There, they would shadow Nima Ward at the Roundhouse as she testified on bills before legislative committees or chatted with representatives and senators in the corridors, urging them to vote for bills that LOGM supported.

LOGM became known as Lutheran Advocacy Ministry-NM (LAM-NM) in the 1990s, and the well-known advocate Ruth Hoffman followed Nima Ward as director. It is almost like coming full circle now that All Saints' Kurt Rager has become LAM-NM's third highly respected director. He leads a Lutheran ministry that has advocated just policies for over thirty-five years in our state. "As congregations, we are called by God to do direct service," Kurt says, "to serve the hungry and the homeless face to face, but we also are called to work upstream, to take care of those systemic problems which can lead to poverty."






Lutheran Advocacy Ministry New Mexico Rocky Mountain Synod ELCA Join us **Saturday, November 19th, from 9 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.** at All Saints Lutheran Church in Albuquerque. (4800 All Saints Road, NW, 87120) Registration and refreshments will begin at 8:30 a.m.

This year's conference will feature special guests Lilly Irvin-Vitela (President, Community Connects Consulting, LLC), Sherry Hooper (executive director of the Food Depot in Santa Fe), Denali Wilson (staff attorney with the ACLU), as well as others, along with opening devotions led by Lynne Hinton (executive director, NM Conference

of Churches). Our theme this year: Working for Justice- How Faith Can Inform Cross-partisan Issue-based Advocacy.

In this interactive event led by Lilly Irvin-Vitella, participants will explore the call to action to engage in public policy that affirms our shared commitments to justice. As individuals and communities of faith, we will share, discuss, and deliberate about effective and principled tools to advance public policy that upholds the values we're called to uphold in the Gospels. We'll also discuss strategies to move beyond partisanship and move into faith-driven approaches that seek common ground and common purpose.

Integrated into the event will be presentations by Sherry Hooper and Denali Wilson centered on two of LAM-NM's priority legislative advocacy efforts for the 2023 NM Legislative Session.

Though we highly recommend in-person attendance for the most impactful experience, an online Zoom option will also be available. Tickets this year are \$18 in-person and \$12 online participation.

Lunch and morning refreshments will be provided for in-person participants. Materials to take back to congregations will be provided to all participants.


The solar panels have been installed. The next step in the process is to connect the panels to the church's electrical "system."

Once the connection is made, PNM must inspect and approve the installation before the system can be turned on.

The Church Council has decided not to take the next steps described above until after the first of the year (2023). The reason for delaying the final steps is to position the church to possibly receive a special "credit" from the federal government, of as much as 30% of the project cost, under the provisions of the "Inflation Reduction Act" signed into law in August. All the requirements and conditions for receiving the special "credit" have yet to be published.

To help keep you apprised of ASLC financial position, the following table provides summary financial information as of the end of September '22.

While the information in the above table is positive, on a YTD basis, during the month of September our revenue exceeded our expenses by \$1,319. On a year-to-date basis, expenses show a decrease of 6.03% (after adjusting for temporarily restricted expenses). At the same time, YTD General Giving is up 9.77% (\$15,908). For the year the preschool is operating at a loss of \$6,181. Thank you for your support, not only financial, but in all of the other ways you support the work of the church.
