## **Advocacy Spotlight**

# Bread for the World Crish Tippit

#### 2023 OFFERING OF LETTERS

On Sunday, April 23, 2023 after the worship service in Fellowship Hall, All Saints will hold its annual Offering of Letters, sponsored by Bread For the World and our OAR Committee. This year we are asking our federal Representatives and Senators to reauthorize the Farm Bill, an important legislation that comes up for renewal every 5 years. Seventy-five percent of this bill consists of SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) which provides benefits to families and individuals who are suffering from food insecurity or outright hunger in the U.S. The Farm Bill also supports funding for international food aid programs such as Food for Peace.

After a series of discussions with groups of all backgrounds, Bread for the World is asking Congress to increase access to fresh fruits and vegetables under SNAP called the Gus Schumacher Nutrition Incentive Program (Gus NIP). This enables SNAP beneficiaries to purchase fresh produce at farmers' markets, a trial program that benefits both the hungry and small farmers.

The 2023 Farm Bill should also eliminate barriers to SNAP for marginalized populations. For example, end the barrier on former drug offenders, eliminate work requirements for college students, and permit indigenous communities to administer SNAP and other federal nutrition programs on reservations.

Other programs included in the Farm Bill are conservation and crop insurance. This year Bread for the World is advocating for addressing the threat to food insecurity posed by extreme weather.

Here are a few statistics about hunger. (from ELCA World Hunger and the Albuquerque Journal 10/27/22)

828 million people around the world go to bed hungry every night.

49 million people are teetering on the edge of famine.

In the U.S. 5 million children live in food-insecure households.

New Mexico ranks 3<sup>rd</sup> in childhood hunger and 7<sup>th</sup> in hunger overall.

In Bernalillo County 1 in 6 residents do not know where their next meal will come from.

Please plan to stay after worship on April 23 to write at least 2 letters--one to your Representative and one to a Senator. A sample letter will be provided and all writing materials will be available. For those not able to stay, take home materials will be available. We will be dedicating the letters on Sunday, April 30 and mailing them immediately after.

Dear Friend and Partner in Christ,

Enclosed you will find documentation concerning your donations to Iglesia Luterana Cristo Rey.

Cristo Rey had weekly worship services all year in 2022. We have continued sharing our services through Facebook Live since many people started following us during the pandemic. We continue to have communion with individual cups since the trends of COVID-19 infections have been high for some time throughout the year. I had COVID-19 for the second time, Pastor Juan and many of our families were infected as well We are taking precautions as needed.

Pastor Juan continues having the study and prayer time through Facebook Live on Wednesdays at 5:00pm and started in-person bible studies on Thursday afternoons.

I started our Confirmation Group and Youth Group in October. I pray that I can find the funds and a person that can help us with that ministry since life has changed so much for me having to raise a baby again.

Cristo Rey has had several financial challenges since the pandemic, and we have not been able to hire a permanent secretary, Border Immersion Assistant, or an After School Coordinator. Even though God provided for our most basic needs in 2022, we are not where we hoped to be. In 2022, Cristo Rey received a gift from Mount Hope Lutheran Church in El Paso who sadly closed their ministry. That has helped Cristo Rey pay for some urgent needs and continue with our ministry this year. We also started having in-person Border Immersion Groups again and that had boosted our income, as well.

Please forgive us if you have not received the usual thank you notes or have been able to reach us through our landline phone number. Pastor Juan works as a Mission Developer in a new ministry at a different location and I had enough on my plate with church duties- leading the Border Immersion Program and the Refugee Ministry. After the death of my daughter, I could not be available for some time. We are hoping to find the funds and a person to help us in the office soon. If you are interested in helping fund this position, the best way to reach us is to text me at 915-422-6545.

I am thankful for Pastor Juan De Dias who took care of things at the church while I was out on leave. We had to postpone his ordination until June 12, 2022. Bishop Gonia, Pastor Maria Paiva, and other pastors from our conference were present at the Ordination Service that was held at Houston Park. We had a special moment when the stole was put on Juan's shoulder by our beloved matriarch Sookie Parra who was 102 at the time. After the service, we went to Cristo Rey to have a special meal and celebration in honor of pastor Juan De Dias. He is now a Mission Developer starting a new ministry on the eastside of El Paso but continues to support our congregation. Cristo Rey has committed to raising \$25,000 this year to cover part of Juan's salary package. Please consider sending a donation for this purpose.

On December 18th, we were able to have our Christmas Posadas for our community. Some of our youth and children participated in the Christmas extravaganza during the service and later we had the-traditional menudo soup, tamales, buñuelos -and-- champurrado. We had mariachis, raffles, candy bags and a piñata for the kids. Our people were so happy to be able to celebrate Christmas at the church again.

Thanks to the help of partners, and a Facebook fundraiser we were able to raise money to buy essential food items for 130 families from our community and some that Live in the Colonias of EL Paso and Juarez.

With the support of New Hope Lutheran Church, and other donations we were also able to distribute gifts and blankets for many of our kids in the After School Program and the church congregation.

Baby blankets made by groups of quilters and small toys were distributed to refugee children in the different shelters we support in EL Paso and Juarez. Every other week, from January to August we went to help refugees in Juarez. We took food for their lunch or dinner, distributed clothing, hygiene kits, and more. We bought \$250 worth of groceries for them to use during the week. We also provided an outdoor worship service, prayers for the refugees, and programming for the kids.

We continued receiving refugees at our church twice a month and during times of emergencies when there were not enough shelters to house them. The cost for each week we receive refugees is about \$500 dollars excluding room and board. That covers groceries, supplies, cleaning, medicines, and other surprise needs. As you-have-heard, in the last months there has not been enough room to house all the refugees and many have been released to the streets. Cristo Rey has been offering a chance for them to shower in our facilities, to eat a warm meal and to use their phones to contact their families. We have a refugee couple who has been living at the church since December 16th. They were part of the 1500 refugees that were released to the streets. Their sponsor could not receive them and through AMMPARO (Accompanying Migrant Minors with Protection Advocacy and Opportunities) we were able to find o Coalition of churches that will receive them in Oklahoma- God's work.

Since the end of December, we have been cooking for 150 refugees staying at Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Downtown EL Paso and preparing snacks for those who are sleeping outside on the sidewalks thanks to the help of our Border Immersion Groups.

Pastor Juan helps on Mondays at St. Christopher Episcopal Church who receives refugees, as well We both have been available to pray for refugees and the team at Border Servant Corps in Las Cruces, NM at least once a month; they have served over 40,000 asylum seekers in the past year. We continue taking meals to one of the shelters of Annunciation House and others as needed. Working with refugees gives me Life and helps me with my pain. By giving hope and showing God's love to others I am strengthened. I have cried several times when I have seen people sleeping in the streets. getting kicked out by police at 2:00am, when they have shared how their journey was when they crossed the jungle, and when they shared how they lost their loved ones on the way.



We continue supporting the ministry of our Missionary Doctor San Juana Mendoza who volunteers at "Dispensario Medico Dental de Servicio Social Cristo Rey" in Juarez, Mexico. She serves those with the most need and little access to care-the most vulnerable. She has been serving a vast number of refugees from Central America and other countries who are stuck in Mexico. Many thanks to our partners and individuals who supported her ministry in 2022.

If it were not for the support from all of you, we would not be able to serve our community the way we do. God is with us. iMuchas Gracias!
