GRIEF GROUP AT ALL SAINTS

Grief takes many forms in our lives, and the experience of grief is different for each of us; and, indeed, different each time we experience it. Our experience of grief can be lightened by support from others, and information and practices around grieving. This spring, Pastor Kristin is offering a grief group for people who are grieving to walk together in the experience, learning together and offering support to one another.

We will gather to learn about grief and to share our experiences in a safe and supportive environment. The group will meet weekly for seven weeks in March and April, on Monday afternoons at 2:00 (skipping one week for spring break). It will be a closed group; after the second session, no new members will join, and we will ask participants to commit to regular attendance. This helps the group to develop trust and deepen learning over time. The dates are: March 6, 13, 27; April 3, 10, 17, 24

Advocacy Spotlight

God's Work, Our Voices

THE BISHOP'S LUNCHEON

As always, the **Bishop's Luncheon** in Santa Fe lifted up the work of the Spirit and inspired us to partner with people who seek a more just society for all. On February 21, at La Fonda, Lutheran Advocacy Ministry honored *four* legislators, making up for the pandemic years when we didn't have the luncheon. Each legislator had persisted with bills that didn't always succeed the first time they were introduced, but what a difference they will make now. Here are the highlights:

Senator Nancy Rodriquez of Santa Fe championed legislation to secure long-term funding for the New Mexico Housing Trust Fund. The Trust supports the NM Mortgage Finance Authority, helping fund initiatives for affordable housing for low- and moderate-income people and for the weatherization of older homes. Sen. Rodriguez also spoke about Linkages, which helps people with mental illnesses access housing and services.

Senator Moe Maestas of Albuquerque, during his years in the House, championed the passage of HJR1 on early childhood education. It led to a constitutional amendment passed by voters in 2022. Sen. Maestas mentioned the many long years of work on the resolution, dating back to the days of Ruth Hoffman. Now, early childhood care and education can be supported partly by interest from the Land Grant Permanent. New Mexico families will benefit—including those with limited economic resources.

Representatives Susan Herrera of Embudo and Joy Garrett of Albuquerque succeeded in capping interest rates on short-term loans at 36%. Before that, high interest rates caught many low-wage borrowers in perpetual repayment cycles. Rep. Herrera spoke of initially considering a 66% cap—more likely to pass--but then her husband asked her what she really wanted. She set the 36% cap. Incidentally, she told us, her husband had been part of an organization that worked with Lutherans on immigration in Washington.

All the honorees mentioned **Lutheran Advocacy Ministry-NM** as a trusted partner in passing their legislation. We did it through **Kurt Rager's** faithful public witness at the Roundhouse and through the calls and emails that we send to our senators and representatives.

The day in Santa Fe offered many more highlights: Pastor Paul Schick's interactive devotions, Pastor Kristin Schultz's luncheon invocation, briefings from justice workers such as Amber Wallin of New Mexico Voices for Children, and the inspiring words of Bishop Jim Gonia. St. Andrew Presbyterian Church, a long-time LAM-NM partner, received the Chris and John Haaland Advocacy Award. St. Andrew advocates on matters of health security and racial justice. They also hold nonpartisan public forums on critical issues where faith and politics intersect. Finally, one of the brightest aspects of the day was the presence of Hannah Rager, at eleven, our youngest attendee. Hannah helped with logistics and conversed with advocates, fully taking part in one of the best events I know of where faith enters the public square.



RIC Taskforce

The RIC Taskforce was formed last year for the purpose of guiding All Saints Lutheran Church through the process of expanding our congregation's commitment to being a Reconciling in Christ (RIC) community as requested by ReconcilingWorks. This will include developing an updated Welcome Statement to be voted on at the 2024 annual meeting. Seven members of the task force attended five and a half hours of training over Zoom with the Reconciling Works staff during 2022. This training oriented us to available resources and ways of engaging our congregation in this discussion.

The taskforce will present multiple learning opportunities and listening sessions for members. The calendar so far includes:

February 19th – Lee briefly introduced our task force and the work for the next few months at the congregational meeting.

February 26th – After worship, faith stories videos from the ReconcilingWorks website were shown and questions for reflection afterwards were shared.

March 26th – After worship, RIC Forum – what do all those letters and acronyms stand for?

April: Individual conversations in our Faith Community. This will be ongoing.

June 9th-10th: Pride Fest. Booth and Communion possibly on Friday night and Saturday at the Balloon Fiesta Park. Pride parade Saturday morning. All members are invited to join in this wonderful celebration.

Family Promise of Albuquerque

Family Promise began in Albuquerque in 2003 and All Saints has been actively involved in the program for nearly 18 years by hosting families in our church for 2-4 weeks a year. Due to the events of Covid in 2020 and its subsequent years, church hosting's ended and families had to be housed in a stationary facility with food being delivered from volunteer churches but volunteers not being able to participate with the families.

As you know, the OAR Committee recently conducted a survey to determine the availability of our congregants to continue providing dinners during our current twice a year weeklong hosting. We know that volunteering remotely at facilities across town instead of at our own church and not being able to interact with families has been difficult. The survey resulted in few people feeling able to continue providing meals or potentially doing overnight hosting. In light of the limited availability of volunteers going forward, the committee has determined that we, as a church, will no longer be able to commit to specific full weeks of hosting. This however will not limit individuals to volunteer independently according to their schedules and Family Promise is working on ways to sign up to do this. Once more specific information is received about this, we will share it with our congregation.

At a recent meeting with Laura Combs, FP Director, we explained the difficulties we were having and withdrew our sponsorship for April and October this year but expressed our commitment to continuing to support the program in any way we can. A check for \$1000 was presented to Laura from All Saints.

Family Promise has had significant delays in the renovation and construction of their new property on San Pedro, however, they have recently received confirmation of \$1.5 million in grants from HUD and the City of Albuquerque which is expected to cover the unexpected code regulations that has pushed their budget well above the initial one. They now have an architect who has drafted plans for the final building and are finalizing on getting a contractor and hoping to begin renovations soon. Unfortunately, building completion is not anticipated until year end. Their dream is to be in the new facility for Christmas 2023. Until then, families will continue to be housed at the Montgomery Church of Christ.

There are many changes and potentially new ways being considered for supporting and participating with FP and Laura is asking for ANY suggestions as well as members to serve on a planning committee.

Thanks to everyone at All Saints who have served so faithfully through the past 18 years helping to make our church a safe and welcoming place for families in transit. Please keep Family Promise in your prayers as they continue this important mission of helping families in our community move on from homelessness.

She has a Masters of Science in marriage and family therapy and is completing her PHD in Mythology with a Depth Psychology emphasis. She has her own private spiritual direction practice, and is working at Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Las Cruces as part time interim associate. We are excited to welcome Pastor Kate to serve among us in caring for and engaging congregation members.

On March 12 worship will include a Litany of Beginning for the new council and Pastor Kate.

Our questions won't necessarily lead to answers, but they can help us find clarity and a new perspective. Ultimately, we pray they lead to new beginnings, restoration, and a wider grace.
