Worship during the three days of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday is often considered to be one continuous service, as we move from the Last Supper and Betrayal to the Resurrection. Maundy Thursday is named after the command (“mandatum” in Latin) to love one another. On Good Friday (called “Good” because by his death Jesus defeated sin, death, and evil) we hear the story of the crucifixion. On Holy Saturday we pause in the moment of stillness between death and life.

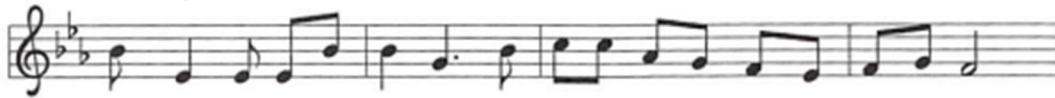

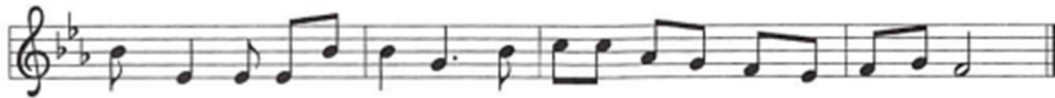

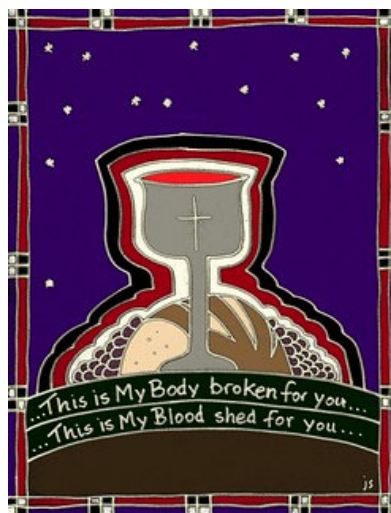
