What Wondrous Love is this, oh my soul... the theme of the recent Association of Lutheran Church Musicians conference which I attended. Each day began with a speaker discussing the first three words: What - Wondrous - Love. Since hearing their views on the words, I began to think to these three words apply to me - and us - here, at All Saints.

WHAT

What is the purpose of music at All Saints? The music planned for every element of every service is used to support the Word of that service. What is God trying to tell us? The words and melody and harmonies of each hymn or anthem are specifically chosen to highlight the Word of God.

WONDROUS

The dictionary defines Wondrous as inspiring a feeling of wonder or delight; marvelous. God's unending, unwavering love and grace for all of us... simultaneously saints and sinners... is wondrous! Music has the ability to change our mindset and mood, changing the way we perceive the world. In our worship, we strive to share music that will inspire you to go out and share the Good News which is God's love and grace for us.

The hymn, For the Fruit of All Creation (ELW 679) beautifully answers the question, What Wondrous Love is this?

1 For the fruit of all creation, thanks be to God. For these gifts to ev'ry nation, thanks be to God. For the plowing, sowing, reaping, silent growth while we are sleeping, future needs in earth's safekeeping, thanks be to God.

2 In the just reward of labor, God's will is done. In the help we give our neighbor, God's will is done. In our world-wide task of caring for the hungry and despairing, in the harvests we are sharing, God's will is done.

3 For the harvests of the Spirit, thanks be to God. For the good we all inherit, thanks be to God. For the wonders that astound us, for the truths that still confound us, most of all, that love has found us, thanks be to God.

Our worship and the music in it begins and ends with God. When we sing together we are linked together in body, mind, and spirit. We become a community in a whole new sense, with each other as well as with all the angels in heaven, singing praises to God.

Does God care if the music we sing and play has some imperfections? Absolutely not! We are not perfect beings, nor are we meant to be. As long as we share our music with heartfelt intention, it is perfect for God.

With that in mind, I ask you to please consider joining one or more of the music ensembles at All Saints. It is our mission to enjoy our times together while we make music for the Glory of God. Making music together in support of the services, each musician in each ensemble has an important role to play. It is a high and worthy calling for us to share music in the name of God. May we rise to this privilege and responsibility of leadership!

May the Word fill your mind and heart. May the music feed your soul. Peace be with you all.

OAR – Outreach, Advocacy, and Rapid Response

Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it for me. (Matthew 25:45)



Albuquerque Asylum Seekers Welcome (AASW) may not be welcoming buses full of asylum seekers each week but there are plenty of other ways that All Saints can assist with this crisis. Who will be the voices for the migrants? Who will pray for the safety and well-being of these people? Who will go out to meet these people where they are?

Several members of All Saints are now working with the Dignity Mission in Placitas, New Mexico. This group delivers three tons of supplies every six weeks to El Paso/Ciudad Juarez which are then distributed to asylum seekers in shelters and in tents. In July, the Dignity Mission delivered 582 pounds of pinto beans, 204 pounds of rice, and 262 cases of food and water. Also included in the delivery were 1,410 dignity kits, 4 cases of feminine hygiene kits, 43 cases of diapers and much more. All of these items are <u>donations</u> from across the United States.

In December, the Dignity Mission will be taking 800 Christmas bags for the children at the border. All Saints will be contributing 150 bags for this mission. Look for an announcement for the date that we will be assembling the bags. The OAR Committee approved \$500 out our restricted account to help pay for the bags. Additionally, All Saints Endowment Committee has sent another \$500 directly to the Dignity Mission.

Advocacy Spotlight

God's Work, Our Voices

The Journey They're On: Rozy Kalsbeek and Terry Messal and Their Friend Rachael Johnson

First, Rozy. Born in Washington, All Saints member Rozy grew up in Los Angeles. She is an avid reader,

singer, and equestrian with a career in administrative work. Her love of geology prompted her to attend New Mexico Tech and CNM to pursue an earth-sciences education. On moving to Rio Rancho in 2011, she sang with the Westside Chorale, with her husband in a '60s band, and, pre-pandemic, with All Saints' choir. She is a member of All Saints' Outreach, Advocacy, and Rapid Response Committee. With her heart for animals, she's also volunteered at Watermelon Mountain Ranch. Her personal ministry leads her to care about people she meets who are unhoused. She offers food, water, socks--and a sleeping bag for the cold nights! Rozy is a Bread for the World advocate and has worked with asylum seekers. For two years, she took



shifts at the Friends Meeting House where a woman from Honduras was in sanctuary. She was trained on how to proceed should ICE come to the facility with a federal warrant.

Now Rozy and her husband, Terry Messal, are on a challenging journey together based on his August 2022 diagnosis of pancreatic cancer. It's a walk of great courage, love, and spirit.

Next, Terry. Born in Portland, Terry is a musician who grew up in Alamogordo and was based in Los Angeles for many years, playing bass in the band Flies on Fire. Founding band member, Tim Paruszkiewicz, said this about Terry's audition: "We wanted him in our band before we ever heard him play [.]... He was and is truly the nicest person I have ever met—he makes me laugh." It turns out Terry was a great bass player too! Flies recorded albums with ATCO and toured North America. They won MTV's Basement Tapes Contest in 1988 and toured with Tragically Hip, which took them along the West Coast. Terry is also the dad of a wonderful son, a social worker, and a creative educator. He has worked for public schools in Los Angeles, Santa Fe, and Albuquerque. He plays music, draws, and writes poetry and prose. He has played with the Albuquerque band Alien Space Kitchen and is a regular on the area poetry scene. He's known as a performance poet with commentary on the human condition. His approaches range from dark wit to light-hearted humor and the hilarious use of props. He's now at work on his first illus-




trated book of poetry. And he is an encourager, seeing the potential in people who may not see it in themselves and kindly urging them forward.

And Rachael. Rachael Johnson and Terry were social workers together. Now an author, Rachael has been published in *The Diné Reader: An Anthology of Navajo Literature*. Her essay, "Nowhere Place," won the Prairie Schooner's 2017 Summer Creative Nonfiction contest. Last month, Jorja Armijo interviewed Rachael on KANW about her new book of poetry, in which she beautifully conveys the perspectives of one who is neurodivergent, gender-fluid, and disabled. The book

is dedicated, in part, to Terry (aka Mess), and on her gratitude page, Rachael thanked him for encouraging her to return to school to pursue writing. "You're a supernova!" she said.

THANK YOU, ALL SAINTS, for the support you are giving Terry and Rozy through prayer, phone visits, cards, and in other much-appreciated ways. Also, as Lutherans across the U.S. are reading works by Indigenous authors as part of the ELCA Truth and Healing Movement, our neighbor Rachael is another writer whose work is available to us. Her book, *My Body Is an Ill-Fitting Costume*, was published this year by Abalone Mountain Press: Abalone Mountain Press

ASLC Solar Project 07-25-23

The permit from the City of Albuquerque (City) for the solar project has been renewed and the "wiring" change completed. Inspections by the City will take place the week of July 24, 2023. After the City has completed its inspection, PNM will be scheduled to "set the meter" which, when completed, will allow the solar system to be activated. The timeline for PNM to complete their work is not set but is anticipated to be 2 -3 weeks.

As you may recall, the reason we needed to renew/extend the permit with the City was to allow for

completion of the installation of the solar project in 2023 in an attempt to qualify for a "credit" (possibly \$20 -\$30,000) available to nonprofit organizations under the Inflation Reduction Act signed into law last summer.

SIERRA VISTA SCHOOL SUNDAY BACKPACK FOOD COLLECTION PROJECT

This August, ASLC and Sierra Vista Elementary School is starting its backpack food collection project.

For many years, the All Saints Community Outreach Committee has sponsored this program twice a year, which provides children from low-income families to take food home on Fridays for the weekend. The drive provides nutritional food and snacks for many families at Sierra Vista Elementary School in Paradise Hills. At one time, over 20 backpacks were being filled each week to be taken home by needy students on Friday for weekend meals.

There are fewer participants at the current restart of this program, but it is expected that more will be added as needs are noted and as the school has supplies available. At this time, Sierra Vista has no sponsors providing food, so staff and some community members supply food as they are able. We at All Saints are pleased to resume this Outreach project once again and sponsor a food drive through August.
