To help keep you apprised of ASLC's financial position, the information in the following table provides a summary of financial information as of the end of August '23.

On a year-to-date basis, expenses show an increase of 1.64% (after adjusting for temporarily restricted expenses). We are thankful that our revenues have exceeded our expenses for the year. However our offerings, for the first 8 months, are down approximately 5.3% (\$8,479). On a YTD basis, for 2023, the preschool financial results show a gain of \$25,918.

2024 Lily Renewal Grant

We have exciting news to share -All Saints and Pastor Kristin received the Clergy Renewal Grant for sabbatical leave in 2024. We will receive \$54,762 in October, of which \$39,862 is for Pastor Kristin's travel and art apprenticeship and retreat time, and \$14,900 is for All Saints to pay for pastoral coverage and have renewal experiences here at church.

The renewal experiences for the congregation include having Entourage Jazz play a service, an art night, a retreat with ELCA Deacon and Coach Tammy Devine, and a "How Lutherans Interpret the Bible" workshop with Rev. Mark Allan Powell.

Thank you to the planning team who helped with the application – Marlee Barnes, Patrick and Rae VanDeMotter, Brian and Randine Hughes. This team will help plan to carry out the congregational events next summer. Thanks also to Kris Ericson for being a reader/consultant; and especially to Jim Kruger and Dan Mazan, who agreed to take on managing and reporting responsibility for the grant. And, thank you to the Congregation Council for approving and supporting this process, and the community of All Saints for all your support and care.

Music Ministry Notes

I have been wanting to delve into the Book of Psalms lately

and thought that it could be a fun thing to do together! So, for the next few months, I will be discussing the Psalms that we use in worship but today, I want to give you a quick Reader's Digest synopsis on the Book of Psalms.

The Book of Psalms is made up of 150 poems, songs, and prayers which express the deepest and most profound emotions, serving as an example of how we should speak to God and with God in an authentic, heartfelt manner. The Psalms were authored by different authors, both known and unknown and all come from different periods of Israels history. Many of the Psalms were written for a choir to sing in Israel's temple, but the Book of Psalms is not meant to be a hymnbook. At its creation, the Book of Psalms was intentionally arranged with a unique design and message. These poems, when read in order, explain the promise of Christ's death and resurrection, and pictures the Messianic Kingdom so perfectly that Martin Luther thought of the Book of Psalms as a little Bible.

Open up your bible to the Book of Psalms and you will notice that the Psalms are sectioned into 5 Books. These sections are designed in order so that there is an introduction, a middle, and a conclusion, much like an essay. The introduction, Psalms 1 and 2, begin the Book by telling us that the Psalms are a way of teaching us the practice of prayer as we obey God's commands as well as reflecting on the day a Messianic king will come. In other words, Psalms 1 and 2 tell us that the Book of Psalms is the prayerbook for God's people as we wait faithfully for Jesus Christ. The middle sections each continue the message of God's promise of the coming Messianic king. The final poem in each book ends in a similar way, that feels like an editorial addition. From the NIV the wording is this: "Praise be to the Lord, the God of Israel, from everlasting to everlasting. Amen and Amen." The conclusion ends with the last

5 Psalms of the Book. Each poem begins and ends the same: "Hallelujah", which translated from Hebrew means, "Praise God".

So, we have learned about the order of the Psalms and that the design is intentional to teach us about God's promises but there is even more to the Book of Psalms than that. Each Psalm is in one of two main categories: Poems of Lament or Poems of Praise. The Lament Psalms are prayers of pain, confusion, and anger. They bring to our attention everything that is



going wrong in the world as ask God to do something about it. These dominate the Psalms in Books 1 – 3. The Praise Psalms are prayers of joy and celebration. These bring our attention to the good in the world which we thank God for. The Praise Psalms dominate in Books 4 and 5. There is a purpose for the placement of Lament and then Praise. It is the nature of prayer. As we pray, we ask God for help with our needs, and we praise and thank God for the love and grace we are given.

In September we focused on health care at the end of life with speakers from Corus Health care. It was an excellent presentation with lots of useful information. We have materials about hospice care and Advance Directives for anyone who missed the session.

October 22 – Legacy

How do you want to be remembered, and what do you want to leave behind? We will talk about what we leave and how we can help those who come after us by planning and documenting our information and plans. Tina Kvitek, Assistant to the Bishop for Generosity, will be with us to talk about estate planning and charitable giving. We will also have information about wills and estate planning.

November 19 – Memorial Service and Final Arrangements

We will discuss options for final arrangements for burial or cremation and about planning services that are a celebration of life for you or your loved ones.

It's not easy to have these conversations, but it is my hope that, by doing this together in our community, we may ease the way for discussions with family and loved ones. We ground our conversations in the faith we share, knowing that these are sacred conversations, and God is with us in every moment.

Solar "Project" Update

As previously reported, "New Mexico Solar," our vendor for the project has gone out-of-business and filed for bankruptcy.

The rep that we were working with at New Mexico Solar reached out and recommended a company (PPC Solar) headquartered in Taos to assist us in completing our project. PPC has been in business for nearly 40 years. I have met with their rep, and he and I inspected New Mexico Solar's installation. The work completed by New Mexico Solar, based on PPC Solar's review meets the requirements of our contract. The placement of one of the panels on the outside wall of the church doesn't meet code requirements. It will need to be lowered.

In our discussions, PPC Solar has indicated that they should be able to complete the project for the amount we would have paid to New Mexico Solar for the last phase of the project (City approvals and PNM meter set). PPC Solar has been in contact with the City and PNM about the necessary requirements for PPC to replace New Mexico Solar as our vendor. PPC is preparing a quote to complete the work on our project.
