


Offering Prayer

The Gospel of the Incarnation

The minister lights a large candle from the center of the wreath, which symbolizes Christ, the Light of the world of whom John's gospel speaks. The ushers light their candles from the minister's candle, then light the candle of each worshiper nearest the aisle. The lighted candle is never tilted, but is always held upright when giving light to another.

John 1:1-14
