Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work. II Corinthians 9:7-8

The verses from II Corinthians were the theme for Day 9 of the Ten Days of Prayer that began our Capital Campaign. The Ten Days of Prayer inspired us

to thank God for our many material blessings and move us to generosity as we contemplate the gifts we will pledge to do God's work in our faith community. As Commitment Sunday draws near, let's reflect on the previous five weeks since "kick-off" Sunday which began with Rev. Dana Peterson.

Reverend Peterson inspired us to recognize the abundance of our blessings and the opportunities to share our hope and blessings within our community. He shared the story of the "cookie lady" who thought it was wrong for the children to take too many cookies, not leaving enough cookies for others in the fellowship hour. The cookie lady was more concerned about a scarcity of cookies for others in the 'here and now,' rather than the abundance of long-term blessings gained by sharing cookies with the children. We, too, are urged to look forward with hope at God's blessings to ourselves and those within our greater faith community as the campaign projects are completed.

Prayer has been an integral part of the Building with Hope and Blessings Capital Campaign. The Ten Days of Prayer brought our attention to God's great gifts and blessings. On Saturday, May 3rd we will have a twelve-hour Prayer Vigil to lift the Capital Campaign to God in prayer along with our hopes and dreams for our congregation. Thirty-minute prayer slots are available for members to spend time in prayer. You are encouraged to sign up in advance so there is at least one person praying throughout the Vigil. A prayer guide will be available at church along with prayer requests from members, Bibles, hymnals and other inspirational materials. You may stay as long as you wish. The Prayer Vigil is a time for our community of faith to come before God and acknowledge that we are the body of Christ, and to ask for God's guidance and presence as we complete our individual commitments on Sunday, May 4. A sign-up poster board is in the front lobby of church. If you are unable to participate at church, you are encouraged to sign up and pray at home. God hears our prayers where ever we are located. Please join your All Saints faith community members at the Prayer Vigil on May 3rd.

Kennon Callahan (1997) in his book Giving and Stewardship in an Effective Church wrote four motivators for giving: Commitment, Challenge, Compassion, and Community. Our four Inspirational speakers, Marlee Barnes, Steve Reil, Katy Anderson, and Larry Shy spoke on these motivators and the importance of the Building with Hope and Blessings Capital Campaign to them and to our congregation. Their words of inspiration lead us to Commitment Sunday, May 4th.

Commitment Sunday will be a joyous time to celebrate God's blessings and our hope for the ministries that occur within this building and beyond our walls. Entourage Jazz will provide music for our service beginning at 9:30AM. Reverend Dana Peterson will preach and be with us as we bring our pledge cards to the altar. A Celebration Brunch will follow our worship service as we await the Campaign "Reveal" on our progress towards meeting the three-year goal of \$400,000. You can make this campaign successful by participating in the events of Commitment Weekend! Please continue to pray for the success of our Building with Hope and Blessings Capital Campaign across the next three years!

• Current Landscape of Immigration & AMMPARO

- Presenter: Mary Campbell, Director of ELCA AMMPARO
- This workshop will include: an overview of the basics of immigration in the U.S.; updates and issues affecting immigrants under the new administration; the ELCA designation as a sanctuary denomination and the role of sanctuary congregations at this time; how AMMPARO engages and supports congregations in immigrant accompaniment.

• Trauma and Immigration

Music Ministry Notes

Christ is Risen! Alleluia! Now what? Do you think Easter is an ending or a beginning? How we view this time after Easter as either a beginning or an ending, leads to how we understand what comes next. In the next few weeks, we will hear stories of how the risen Jesus showed himself to his disciples and his teachings about faith and intimacy with God which will inform us that Easter is indeed a both/and situation of ending AND beginning.

When the tomb is found empty, the people do not recognize Jesus as he appears to them. Mary Magdelene thought he was a gardener. His own disciples did not even recognize him until he showed them his wounds. It is an innate quality to question... to doubt until the research has been done. Thomas had to see the wounds for himself. Seeing is believing, after all... Jesus accepts this need for validation but also urges us to zoom out and focus our understanding on higher, more important matters. Signs and wonders are easy to believe in, but we are meant to have faith that flourishes even when we can't see. This faith allows us to perceive beyond the surface signs and wonders.

And so, we put an end to our doubts and begin to name, affirm, and explore them in a life of faith. Does this mean that we just believe everything? No! Much of the scripture warns against letting our believing become too settled. As the Swiss theologian Karl Barth has said, the stories filled with signs and wonders (and resurrection stories most of all) are designed to astonish — and astonishment, after all, is a blend of belief and disbelief. Accordingly, we should neither merely "believe" or "disbelieve" miracle stories (for that would mean we aren't truly astonished by them). Rather, these stories should leave us continually "taken aback," helping us call into question our assumptions about what may or may not be "possible" and "impossible," and thereby inviting us into an open-minded, open-hearted posture of Easter faith, Easter doubt, and Easter joy.

Bless Now, O God, the Journey – ELW 326

Bless now, O God, the journey that all your people make, the path through noise and silence, the way of give and take. The trail is found in desert and winds the mountain round, then leads beside still waters, the road where faith is found.

Bless sojourners and pilgrims who share this winding way; your hope burns through the terrors, your love sustains the day. We yearn for holy freedom while often we are bound; together we are seeking the road where faith is found.

Divine eternal lover, you meet us on the road. We wait for land of promise where milk and honey flow, but waiting not for places, you meet us all around. Our covenant is written on roads, as faith is found.
